This small rural cemetery is picturesquely sited just above a bend in the Williams River, with access by river ford only, and surrounded by enclosing hills with views to the Barrington Ranges to the Northwest. The monuments, ranging from the early 1900's are mainly (20th tablets with white marble obelisks, some topped with urns, some modern tiled slabs, and one marble angel. The earliest monument is to Jane Kavanaugh (infant) d.1901. The site is on an elevated plain, sloping to the river, with sparse vegetation consisting of kikuyu grass and several paperbark trees surrounded by a post and wire fence.


The monuments are in a very dramatic landscape setting on a completely isolated site. The scattered vertical monuments are very evocative of a small isolated rural community in the early 1900's.



East Gresford Catholic Cemetery is on a flat site, covered with kangaroo grass. Paths are mown between the utilitarian north-south rows of gravestones. 3 stone pines are situated at the southern end, one in the east and 2 in the north-east. There are two Pinus Radiata on the southern boundary. Plantings evident are ornamental oxalis and jonquils. The site is enclosed by a post and wire fence; entered through an iron gate with cross. Within the cemetery there are five wooden crosses; one at the centre of the cemetery and one in the centre of each of the four sections, North/South/East/West. There are remains of another wooden cross in a cast iron surround, located in the oldest section of the cemetery. There is a range of materials and styles present. Use is made of red, grey and black granite, marble and sandstone, showing the range of tastes over late 19th Century and early 20th Century: 1866-1900 sandstone headstones, 1893-1926 marble crosses, 1900's marble headstones, 1950's standard concrete slabs and marble/granite inset.

There are also two marble columns circa 1900, one a Gothic column with ornate urn (Michael O'Brien 1888, born Salisbury, Tipperary, Ireland) and the other broken (J Kevin 1903, sometime inspector of state schools). Notable monuments include the sandstone cross to Ann Richardson d 1876, with 4 motifs on either arm: lamb with wings, lion, eagle and angel, and the black granite 1914 headstone to Braune.



Other features are the range of monuments present and a strong visual link with the nearby church.

St Anne's Anglican churchyard occupies a small spur which runs south behind the red brick church. It is bounded by post and wire fence. A tasteful columbarium has been incorporated into the eastern wall of the church building. The cemetery has a pleasant outlook to cleared hills and/or valleys in all directions. An informal mown north/south path divides the site which is dominated by a 20m cypress at the centre. Monuments lie in five rows, all of which face east. There is no chronological pattern or layout development evident - older graves and more recent ones are intermingled. One sandstone monument to George Townshend (1872) beside the columbarium has been reset in concrete and faces north. The earliest grave is the simple sandstone altar sarcophagus halfway along the eastern boundary to Emma Australia Boydell (1850).

An excellent array of monumental styles is present: two Georgian altar sarcophagi, early sandstone tablets with floral motifs, a number of sandstone and granite crosses, columns and urns and a wide variety of gothic tablets with assorted motifs and designs. Six cast iron surrounds survive but there is evidence of others. The cypress tree is the only major planting evident. Various bulbs, agapanthus, jonquil, oxalis, creepers and other traditional species grow within plots and are also scattered across the mown lawn. One other notable grave has a cast iron surround and attached metal plate but no headstone. A weatherboard privy stands beside the remains of a wooden turnstile on the eastern boundary. The latest burial is Louise Gill (1950)


St Anne's Church of England cemetery has an intimate relationship with its church and the surrounding countryside. Its layout is dictated by the site topography and along this spur the monuments are located. They express a diverse stylistic development.



History The cemetery flanks the church on 3 sides with views over river flats to rock face cut out by river to east. Adjacent to northern boundary

Location & Surroundings the river bank drops sharply away and the sound of running water is heard throughout the cemetery. The layout is grid with no obvious paths or driveway. Monument materials: Sandstone - 1840s-1900, Marble headstones 1874-1911, blocky marble headstones 1920s (few later).


Landscape Granite and marble tablets 1930's-60s, few recent granite, tile and terrazzo slabs. Swedish black granite 1916. Monuments: Thomas Hancock d 13.2.1852 (pioneer) - sandstone h'stone reinscribed by descendants, 1982 Henry Fowler d 18.5.1864 - 3rd son of John Fowler of Ashley Lincolnshire England. Cornet in H.M. 9th Hussars - s'stone headstone with downturned torches and very elegant footstone. Boydell Family - 3 grand sandstone slabs, Henry Broughton Boydell d 17.10.1849 - slab on sand stone base. Mary Phoebe Boydell d 30.7.1867 - eldest daughter of William Grant Broughton - first bishop of Australia.

Reasons for Listing This charming churchyard displays a fine range of monuments and surrounds. Its major interest is the association with Bishop Broughton who made it a condition of his daughter's betrothal that William Boydell erect the adjacent church. The extensive involvement of the Bishop with this cemetery is documented on his daughter's unusual tomb.



A picturesquely sited church graveyard on a west facing slope just below the brick church.

Several large eucalypts, clumps of Agapanthus and a few roses enhance the setting and kangaroo grass and periwinkle create a dense ground cover. The monuments range from 1880's sandstone tablets, through vertical granite (1914-27) and marble (1915-23) monuments to marble/stone composite slabs (1910-50) and tiled slabs (1950's - 1970). The chief feature of the graveyard is the unusual variety and number of 'country' style flat wrought iron grave surrounds with decorative corner posts, peculiar to the district.

**Reasons for Listing**

This is a romantic country church graveyard which contains a good range of monuments and very good examples of local wrought iron in good condition.



This burial ground has an absolutely picturesque setting on a spur running down to the Williams River. Views to broad gravel shoals of the river and magnificent mature Eucalypts on surrounding land create a beautiful and restful landscape (feeling of age). A split post and rail fence surrounds the site and the entrance is marked by fine rustic iron gate. Kangaroo Grass has been allowed to grow long and only pathways are mown. Regenerating Eucalypts threaten some monuments. Old fashioned roses mark some graves. One area surrounded by cast iron contains 14 monuments to the Smith family; earliest being to Elizabeth Smith. Twin Book Leaf Cypress also occur in this section. A very good collection 1850-80s sandstone monuments by Cobby, Roseby, Browne & Terry. Marble monuments occur after 1880 and composite granite after 1936. One unusual flat iron surround encloses one grave (Netherton-Crown-Best, stamped on iron work).


The picturesque setting makes it one of the most scenic cemeteries in the Hunter Valley. A range of monumental styles, all of consistent high quality are present as are several outstanding examples of iron surrounds fashioned by local craftsmen. The cemetery is intact, has features such as vernacular fences, ironwork and gates, which are absent at many burial grounds. These combine with the plantings and setting to create a sublime element in the rural landscape.







The cemetery lies on a flat site surrounded by very scenic hilly countryside. Most graves are concentrated at the eastern and western ends. At the centre of the site graves are more sparse. The northern boundary has a weldmesh fence (possibly replaced a timber and carved picket fence - probably burned down). A split post and rail fence lines the east, south and west boundaries. Three mature pines and three eucalypts are clustered in the north-eastern corner of the site while the rest of the site is devoid of trees, except for a north-south row of six oleanders which line the centre of the site. Very broad range of styles - 1850's - 1880's naive (angels) to sophisticated (coats of arms). Many interesting inscriptions giving good biographical information (Irish pioneers).

Monuments of note include:

Sarah Bruyn d 1882 - handsome stone headstone - angel's face and wings, garland of flowers topped by cross (Browne) - elegant iron surround

Crawford Logan Brown Esq. d 1859 - very impressive sarcophagus with Coat of Arms and Crest. The Crest: a demi-eagle displayed with two heads azure. The arms: azure three martlets in chief, in base are three chess rooks sable. The motto reads "SUIVEZ RAISON" ("Follow Reason") on a scroll beneath the shield. The arms are those of John Brown Esq. of Lea Castle, Worcestershire, who was High Sheriff of that county in 1833


