Four generations of the Fisher family have farmed the land during this time until its sale to the Hunter Water Board in 1986 for the proposed Tillegra Dam. The dairy and original post and rail yards are important early structures and record the use of the property for dairying and beef cattle. The post and rail yards of hand hewn timber and caping rail are a rare element in the local area and increasingly rare in NSW and the slab wall construction in the dairy is an increasing rare building type. The burial site records the families associated with the property and the high rate of infant death.

Historical notes

The land on which Summer Hill is sited was granted to Archibald Mosman who failing to improve the land as a of provenance: condition of the grant was forced to sell the land at auction in 1856. William Souter Fisher purchased the one block and then subsequently added to his land holdings. William Fisher married Jessie McLennan and they had 5 daughters and two sons. Both were free settlers, William had come from England on the "John Beresford". He initially settled and worked in the Gresford area for a Mr Crowther. William and Jessie's daughters married and left the Munni district and the two sons remained. One at Underbank and the other on Summer Hill. (William is Lorna Johnson's Great Grandfather). Duncan Archiblad Fisher inherited the property and he had two sons William and Bertie Austin Fisher. Bertie is Lorna Johnson's father and he contiued to farm Summer Hill and died in 1984. Graham Stanley Fisher, Bertie's son, sold the property to the Hunter Water Board in 1986.

> The farm practices during the years of occupation have included dairying, beef cattle production and growing of vegetables and lucerne hay.

> A number of earlier strutures have been destroyed since 1986. These include the homestead which was destroyed by fire in 1998. The hay shed, ceamery, tool shed and garage were all demolished. The only remaining intact structures on the property are a recent three bedroom brick cottage, a dairy and adjoining yards including a cattle race and earlier yards and .

- -John Fisher who died as an infant in 1863. He was the tenth child of Williaam and Jessie Fisher.
- -Mary Ann Henwood (nee Cowling) 1816-1863, wife of William Henwood.
- -John McKenzie Keppie 1867-1870, third child of James and Johanna Keppie.
- -Jessie Winifred Simmons 1872-1873, third child of William Foord and Elizabeth Simmons.
- -Richard Ford Simmons 1874-1877, fourth child of William Foord and Elizabeth Simmons.
- -A baby Fisher 189, 8th child of Willima Foord and Elizabeth Simmons.

Physical description: A number of earlier structures have been destroyed since 1986. These include the homestead which was destroyed by fire in 1998. The hay shed, creamery, tool shed and garage were all demolished. The only remaining intact structures on the property are a recent three bedroom brick cottage, a dairy and adjoining yards and cattle race and earlier yards cattle yards.

> The homestead is described by Lorna Johnson as a four bedroom weatherboard house. The homestead and outbuildings are photographed and described in the Heritage Study 1986 as "Large old timber house, probably c.1920. Symmetrical design with low pitched, bellcast roof. Corrugated iron, gambrelled on main ridge. Vernadah on three sides. Now partly enclosed. Fibro balustrade is also more recent? Simple timber posts and brackets. Gablet over entry. Timber and iron outbuildings of special note for their (vertical) rough slab construction. Visible in distance from road." There is little obvious evidence of the house except for building materials strewn on the site and remnant garden plants.

The existing brick house is a recent building. The dairy is extant and is a timber framed building of bush timber construction. It is supported with log posts and sappling rafters and clad in galvanised iron. A section of the dairy which may have been pens for calves or storage area is clad with split slabs and is partially collapsed. The bails are separated with timber circular sawn boards with evidence of a white wash finish. Hand forged fixtures such as hinges are evident.

The stock yards include the yards adjoining the dairy and the cattle race.

Earlier stockyards are evident to the west of the house. These are constructed with hand hewn timbers of post and rail construction with a high capping rail. The yards follow the natural terrain unlike later yards which are usually built on flat land.

The slab, foundations and drainage for the creamery are evident to the south of the dairy. This was built at some
