The cemetery is sited on flat ground adjacent to a meandering creek. Dense vegetation lining the creek forms a visual boundary to the south east. The grid layout is made more interesting with 2 gravel roads delineating areas (one curvilinear). Gravestones predominantly face east but a number face north and south. Burning and weed killer has been used to control weed growth. This process has damaged some monuments and destroyed some timber picket surrounds. Monuments date from the 1860s and there is very good collection of 1860s-1880s stones (they appear to be of earlier design), most are carved from Ravensfield sandstone by Browne (Maitland).

Monuments of note include:

William Wilding d 1867 - handsome sandstone monument with columns and draped urn - has been repaired with bronze dowels. David Johnston d 1876 - stylish very large headstones with columns and draped urn in bas-relief. Many inscriptions have been painted. Numerous glazed Victorian ceramic tiles are present.

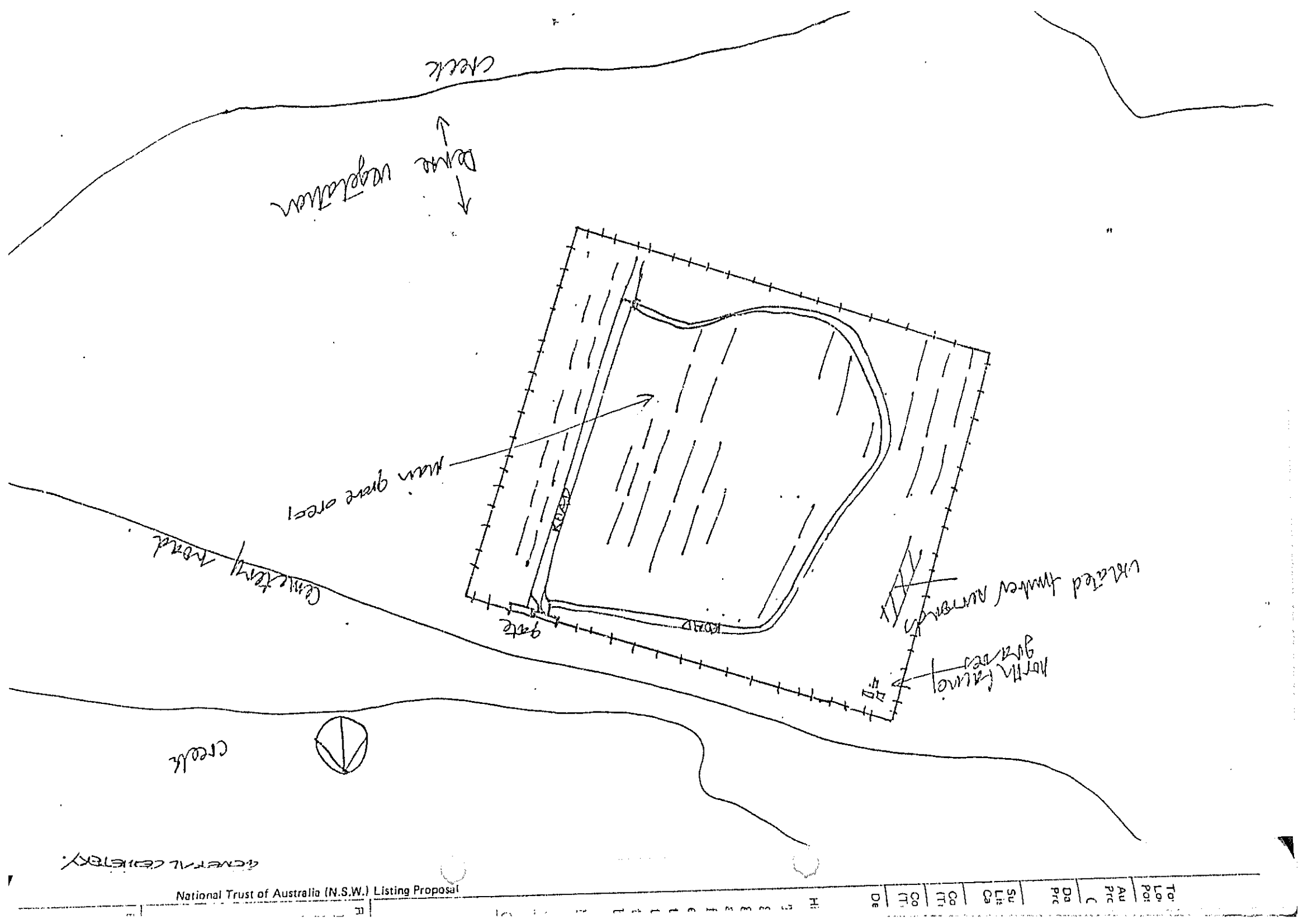
A large, early cemetery, containing distinctive and major local family monuments. Unusual for its extent the cemetery forms an attractive setting on the outskirts of the town.

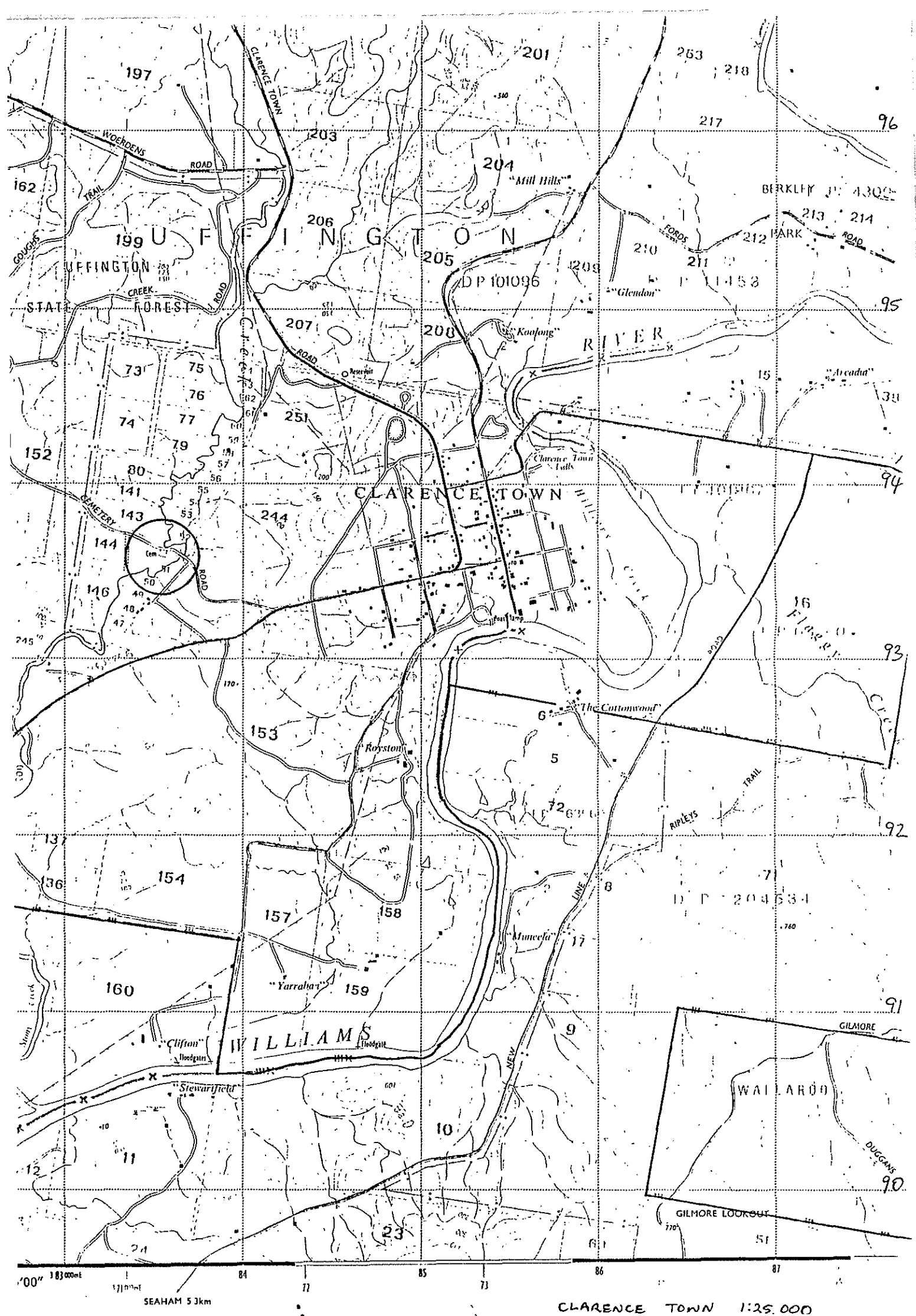

St Paul's cemetery has an outstanding array of early monuments covering both popular and unusual styles from the second half of the nineteenth century. It lies behind the church overlooking a cleared common and the river to the East and is bordered by olive, fig and silky oak trees. Few traditional plantings survive other than oxalis and the occasional bulb. More common are pampas grass, dandelion and a prolific range of weeds. Maintenance appears minimal - growth is possibly kept in check by the large number of visitors the site receives. (It is a local tourist attraction.) The layout shows definite development with the earliest monuments near the church and later ones towards the river. Numerous examples of ironwork occur: simple surrounds, a flat wrought design, assorted combinations of cast and wrought types. The grave of Robert Andrews (1889) includes a cast iron easel with wreath and "in memoriam". Early monuments demonstrate a remarkable range in sandstone examples: simple Georgian tablets and footstone, naive angels, sarcophagi, doves, scrolls, bevelling and floral motifs. The later section includes Gothic tablets, urns, columns and obelisks in marble and granite. An enormous amount of early biographical data is documented on the headstones, many of which mark the graves of early settlers. One additional feature is a number of graves marked by headstones on which the inscription faces outside the surround, away from the footstone.

Notable monuments:

John Alford and Family 21.8.1884. Sandstock brick altar with sandstone tabletop surmounted by cubic sandstone pillar inscribed with verse itself topped by ornate open urn.
William Arnold 26.10.1875 (Drowned in flood of Paterson River) Medieval sarcophagus in sandstone with stylized cross. 19 years Speaker of Assembly. (cont'd over)

Reasons for Listing

This is an exceptional example of a church graveyard in use until the end of the nineteenth century. The sandstone monuments are of a fine quality sculpture and many retain original iron surrounds. The density of monuments attests to the absence of vandalism and the continuous care which have left this cemetery as a rare example of an intact country church cemetery.

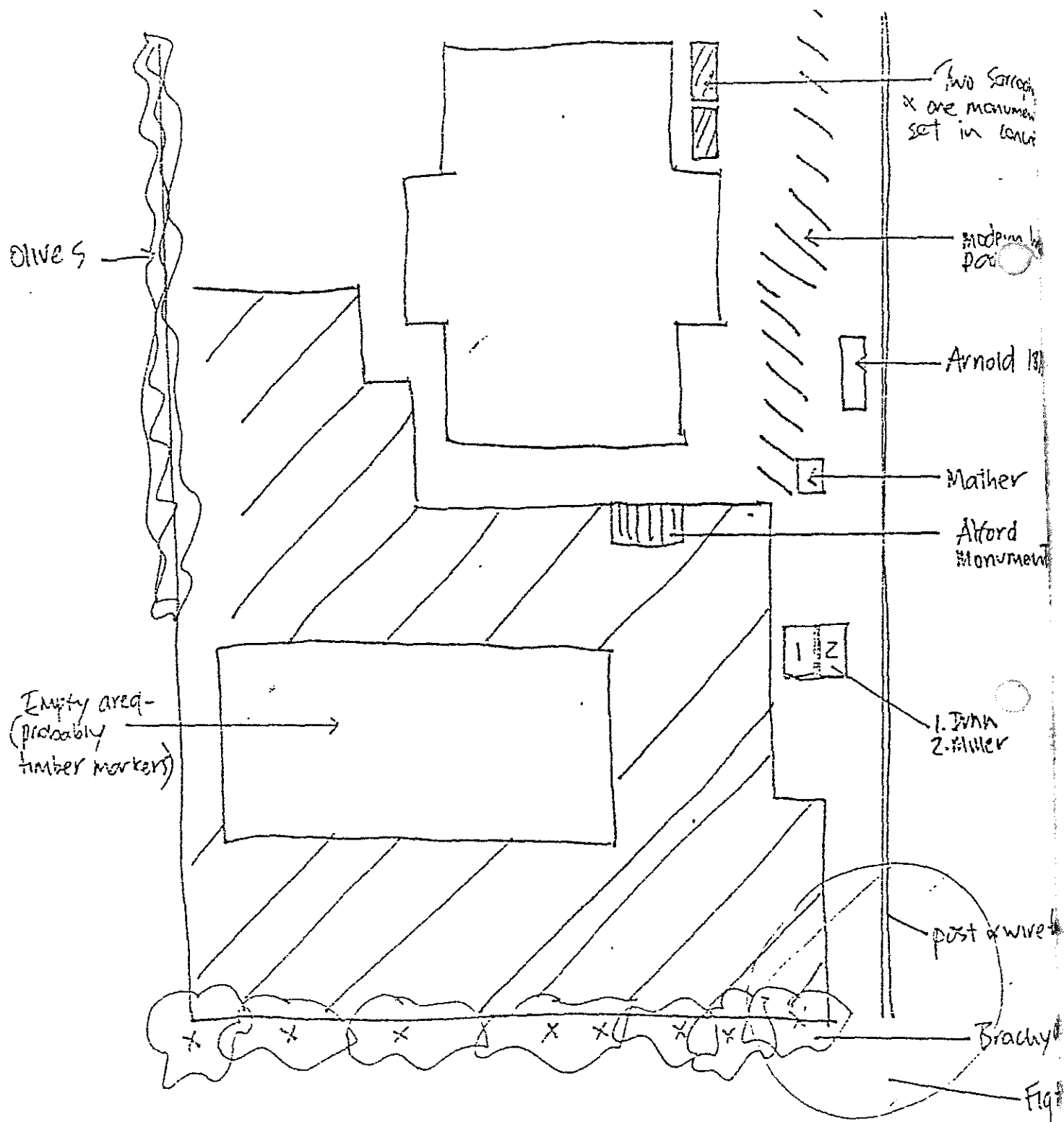

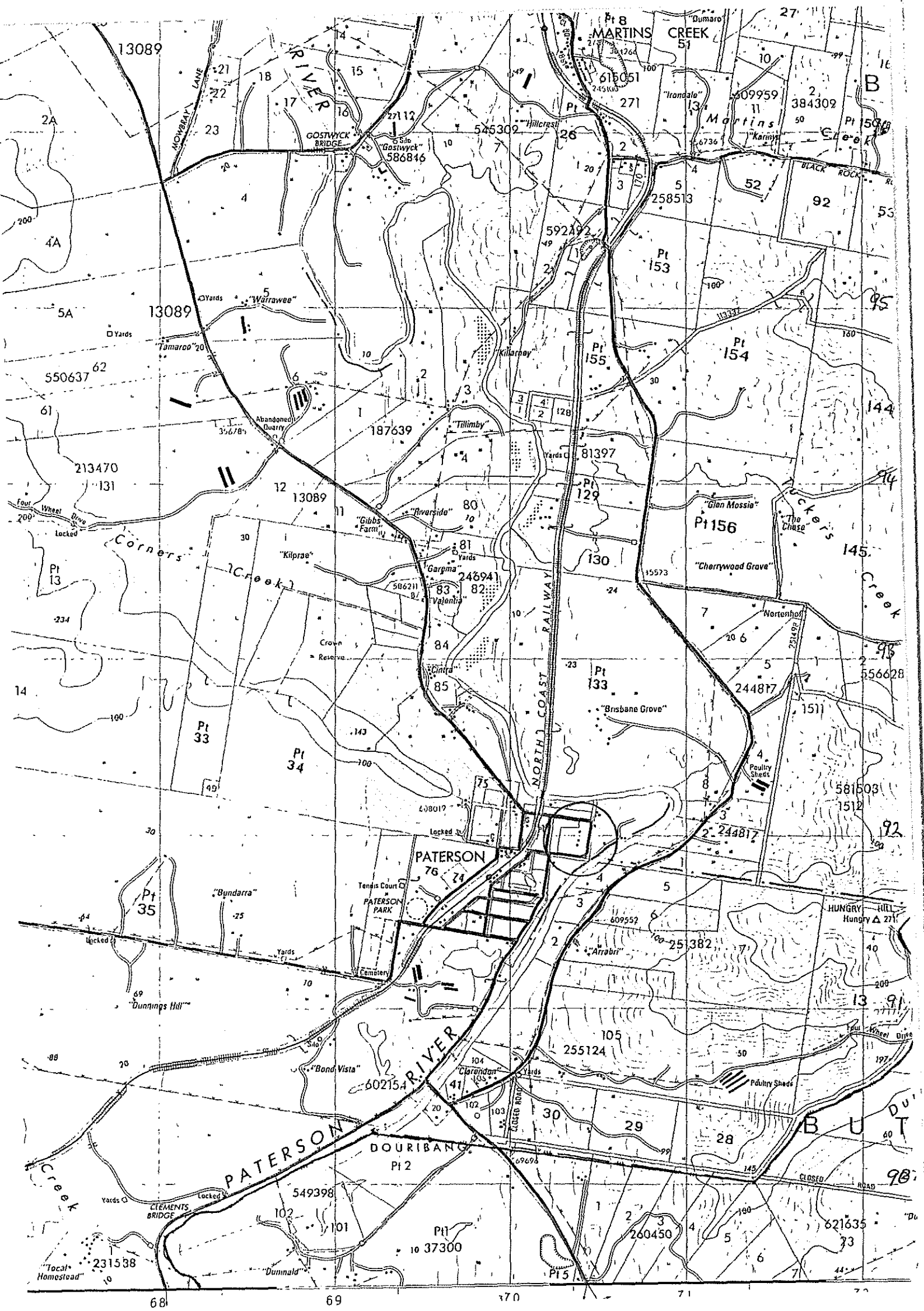
Style is Early Gothic Revival, constructed of stone with galvanised iron roof. Nave porch and vestry, rubble stone interior with walls rendered. Unusual Tudor windows with timber tracery, wainscot to nave. Entrance door to two panels, fielded, with large key in door. Cemetery surrounding church of considerable historic interest. Consecrated on November 27th, 1845 St. Paul's Church and adjoining graveyard by Bishop Broughton. Built mainly at the expense of the first incumbent, Rev. James Jennings-Smith, who arrived in Sydney with his wife and ten children on 29th September, 1839. Large window in Church has coat of arms of Jennings-Smith. Interior has cedar pews, open-backed with book rest, panelled dado, timber pulpit. Present condition good, boundaries of listing - present Church of England, land and adjoining graveyard.

Reasons for listing


Simple and delightful early Gothic Revival Church with adjoining graveyard containing gravestones of considerable historic significance.

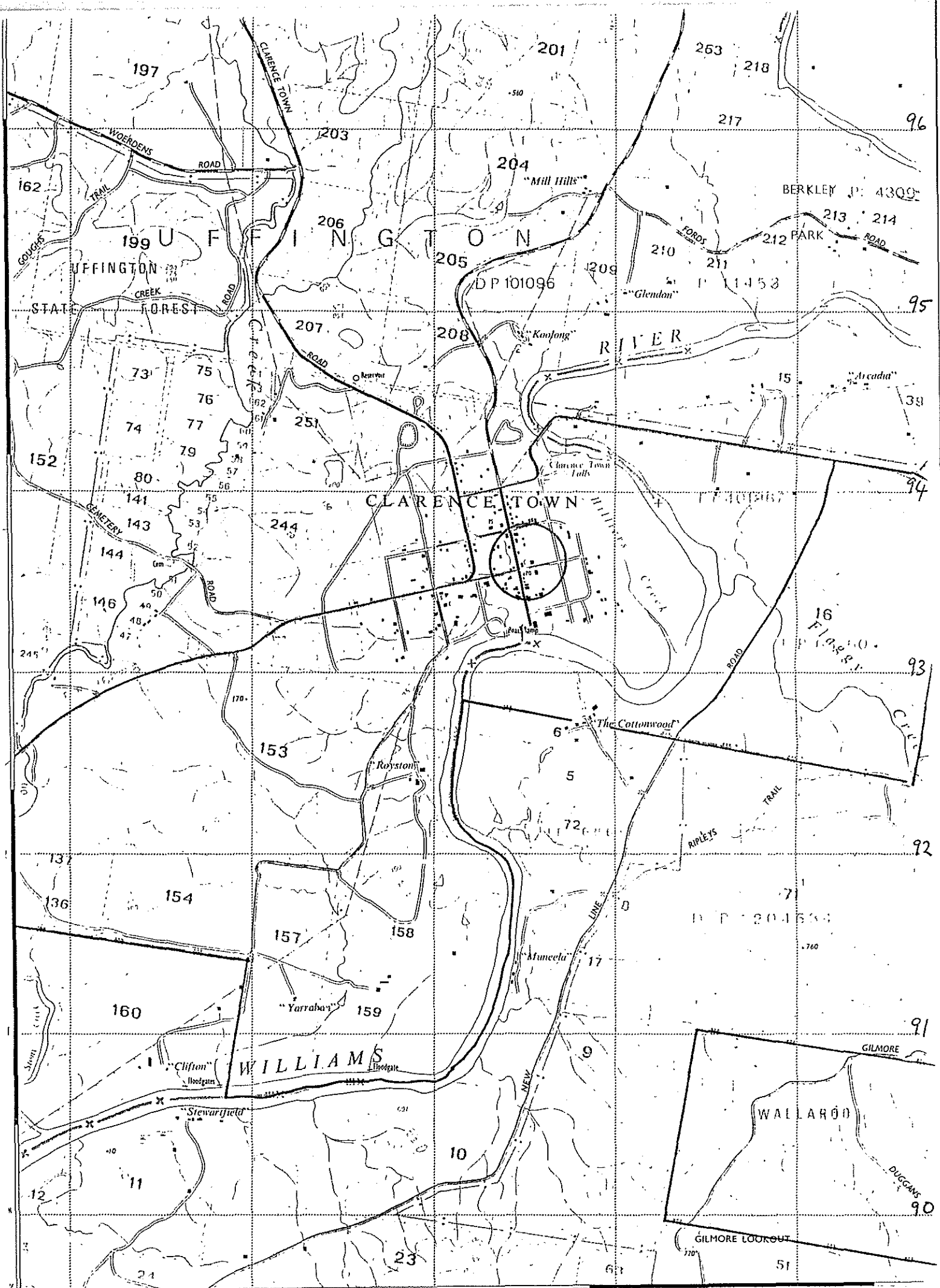
