# Dungog Shire Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Grants

### Guidelines and Application Form

Dungog Shire Council's round of **Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Grant** is funded via the Bushfire Community Recovery and
Resilience Fund (BCRRF), provided through the joint Commonwealth/State
Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

This fund is designed to support community recovery and resilience to future disasters by funding community-led projects and initiatives that will promote community well-being, social and broader recovery and/or future disaster resilience/preparedness following the bushfires. This round has allocated up to \$50,000 to fund local smaller-scale, short term community projects within **Dungog Shire LGA.** 

The BCRRF guidelines have been developed in consultation with Emergency Management Australia and are supported by the National Bushfire Recovery Agency. Resilience NSW are the lead disaster management agency for NSW, responsible for all aspects of disaster recovery and building community resilience to future disasters.

# **Objective**

The objective of the BCRRF is to deliver flexible, small-scale grants to local councils for smaller-scale, locally led community recovery activities. The purpose is to support communities to overcome the social impacts of bushfires and support resilience building within the community.

# **Eligibility**

Dungog Shire Council BCRRF Grant Program applications must meet the following criteria:

- The project must be delivered within the Dungog Shire Local Government Area
- The project must be completed prior to 29 December 2023
- The project must align with a Disaster Recovery Outcome (see Outcomes on the next page)
- Maximum funding per project is \$10,000







- The applicant must be an incorporated non-government organisation, not-for-profit organisation, local community group, business chamber or industry group/peak body, unincorporated community group/cooperative
- Applicants must have the capacity and capabilities to establish, manage and be held accountable for the delivery of the project and intended outcomes
- Applicants must have the ability to report on the progress and agreed outcomes of the project

As per the BCRRF Phase two, Stream 1 Guidelines, the following projects will not be eligible for funding:

- · Applications that request ongoing program funding
- Applications for projects and/or activities that are not related to community recovery/resilience attributed to the bushfire event
- Applications that request covering existing debts or budget deficits

#### **Disaster Recovery Outcome**

Applications must describe how the Project contributes to fulfil one or more of the following Disaster Recovery Outcomes:

- **1.** The needs of vulnerable groups are addressed in disaster recovery
- 2. The community can express its changing disaster recovery needs
- **3.** Community members are aware of the risks of future disasters
- **4.** The community has improved capacity and capability to respond to future disasters
- **5.** Business and not-for-profits have in place adequate mitigation practices for risks and threats
- **6.** Government, private sector, civil society and organisations are engaged in plans for preparedness and management of the recovery

# **Grant Fund Timing**

This Grants Program is intended to be delivered in accordance with the following schedule:

- Grant funding applications open on Monday 1 May 2023
- Applications close 5pm, Friday 30 June 2023
- Applications determined and successful projects announced week commnecing 24 July 2023
- Projects must be delivered prior to 29 December 2023







#### **Selection Criteria**

Grant applications will be assessed on the following criteria:

- Total project cost
- Community benefit
- Capability to deliver and manage the project
- Alignment with disaster recovery outcomes

Please ensure that you have read and understood the guidelines as outlined in this document, before completing this application. It will help you determine if you are eligible for funding.

If you are eligible and can commit to the Guideline Conditions, complete this form and submit it by Friday 30 June 2023.
